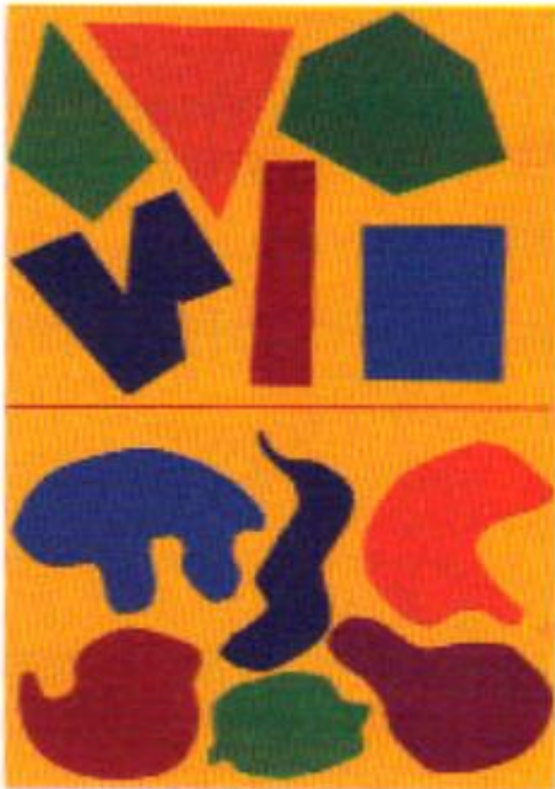

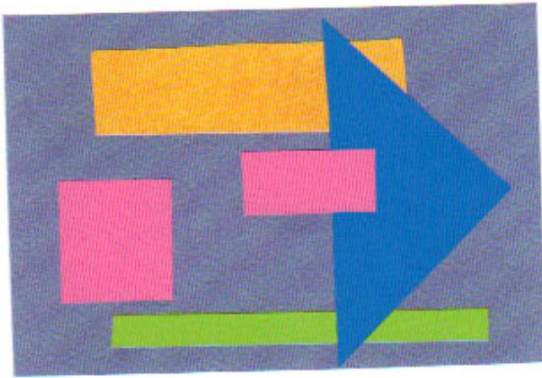

	Type of lines	Answer
1	 <p>In abstract or nonobjective art, positive shapes are usually central or featured elements; negative shapes surround them.</p>	<p>A</p> <p>B</p> <p>C</p> <p>D</p>
2	 <p>Shapes are either positive or negative. The subject in a representational work is usually the positive shape (the sheep).</p>	<p>A</p> <p>B</p> <p>C</p> <p>D</p>
3	<p>Shapes in nature are usually organic: leaves, trees, mountains, butterflies, tigers, etc.</p> <p>Abstraction often reduces things to their simplest shapes. Here shapes portray the start of a marathon.</p>	<p>A</p> <p>B</p> <p>C</p> <p>D</p>
4	<p>All shapes can be described with two basic terms: 1) geometric shapes, also called rectilinear shapes; and 2) organic shapes, also called curvilinear shapes.</p>	<p>A</p> <p>B</p> <p>C</p> <p>D</p>

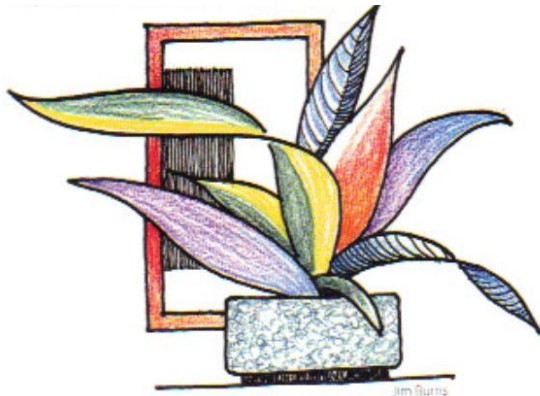

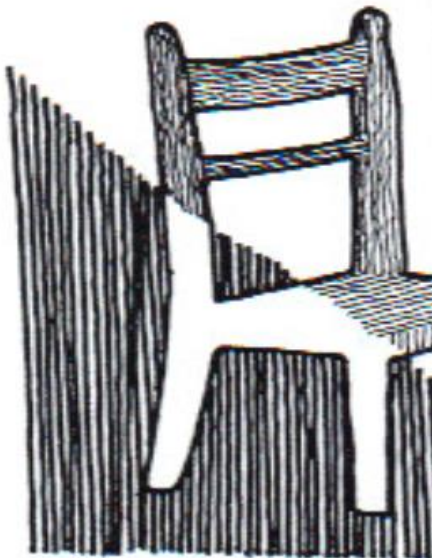
