	Type of lines	Answer
1	In abstract or nonobjective art, positive shapes are usually central or featured elements; negative shapes surround them.	A B C D
2	Shapes are either positive or negative . The subject in a representational work is usually the positive shape (the sheep).	A B C D
3	Shapes in nature are usually organic: leaves, trees, mountains, butterflies, tigers, etc. Abstraction often reduces things to their simplest shapes. Here shapes portray the start of a marathon.	A B C D
4	All shapes can be described with two basic terms: 1) <i>geometric</i> <i>shapes</i> , also called rectilinear shapes; and 2) <i>organic shapes</i> , also called curvilinear shapes.	A B C D


